Tuesday is Fast!

Each Tuesday, pledge to fast. Fasting is such an important spiritual disciple. It reveals to the faster how much he or she is depending on God to build a life (and a church). Options:

a. You can fast from Monday evening (after dinner) until Tuesday dinner time. This kind of fasting is subject to medical conditions and the type of work you do, i.e., it is not feasible to go without meals in some occupations (e.g., surgeons need calories to avoid mistakes!)

b.Fast one meal

c.Fast by giving up something you normally eat (biscuits, chocolate, coffee). Fasting is not ritualistic. The absence of normal food/food items creates hunger that drives our attention to God in prayer and our need of Him.

- In thinking of our neighbours living within our parish boundary, today we pray for the residents of four streets off the western section of the Upper Lisburn Road, namely Black's Road, Larkfield Avenue, The Hawthorns and William Alexander Park. May they keep well and have good encounters with members of our congregation.
- This month James is taking us through the book of Nehemiah, where we read of the Godinspired rebuilding of the city of Jerusalem and of the worshipping community who had previously lived there. Thank God for the example of Nehemiah and how in Lowe we too have been rebuilding – though on a much smaller scale than Nehemiah. Pray that through our recent physical efforts we will be able to be a greater witness in and to the local community and not just to our own fellowship.
- Last Sunday evening we had a presentation from a representative of TearFund. It is always thrilling to hear from TearFund and Christian Aid of the wonderful work they both achieve in benefiting lives of individuals and communities across many countries. Let us remember the families struggling with the effects of drought, disease and civil disorder. May we give thanks for what the relief organisations achieve and pray that many other folk will be moved to support them financially, on the ground or with their prayers.
- Finally may we pray for the beleaguered country of Ukraine, uncertain of not only its immediate future but also that of its long-term prospects. Pray that the diplomatic solution being so earnestly sought by many western nations soon becomes a reality and there is no bloodshed which currently seems to be a distinct possibility.
