## PRAYER. ROOM: UNLESS THE LORD BUILDS THE HOUSE...

James has urged us to pray earnestly to seek God's will for the way forward for Lowe after the pandemic and all the changes and opportunities that that brings. The Prayer Room has been set up with that theme in mind. Why not spend some quiet reflective time in our lovely prayer space? It is available anytime that the church premises are open.

## **Tuesday is Fast!**

Each Tuesday, pledge to fast. Fasting is such an important spiritual disciple. It reveals to the faster how much he or she is depending on God to build a life (and a church). Options:

- a. You can fast from Monday evening (after dinner) until Tuesday dinner time. This kind of fasting is subject to medical conditions and the type of work you do, i.e., it is not feasible to go without meals in some occupations (e.g., surgeons need calories to avoid mistakes!)
- b.Fast one meal
- c.Fast by giving up something you normally eat (biscuits, chocolate, coffee). Fasting is not ritualistic. The absence of normal food/food items creates hunger that drives our attention to God in prayer and our need of Him.

- At present our thoughts are very much with the Martin family in Malvern, where Doreen is recovering from her recent operation, but recovery will be slow as she will need additional medication for a while. Pray not only for Doreen, but also for Ken who unsurprisingly is deeply concerned about Doreen. Pray also for James who too is concerned about his mother.
- This week we think of the residents of four streets on the outskirts of our parish area Black's Road, The Hawthorns, William Alexander Park and Larkfield Avenue. Pray for their general welfare and that they may have friendship and fellowship with their neighbours. Pray that the Holy Spirit works a good work in their lives.
- The threatened war situation in Ukraine still seems unresolved, and we need to pray for cool
  heads on the part of the leaders of all neighbouring countries and those who have been
  attempting to defuse the situation or have been making unhelpful comments. Let us also
  pray particularly for the inhabitants of Ukraine as they either fearfully stay in their homes,
  move away from threatened spots or attempt to flee the country.
- The members of Session are preparing for an important conference coming up at the end of the month. Pray for them as they seek God's guidance on how they consider strategies for developing and improving congregational life in all its aspects. Pray too for the special speaker who will be leading discussions.
